Minutes of Meeting held at St. Mary's National School, Blessington on Monday, 10 December 2012 at 8.00 p.m.

Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting held on 8 October 2012 were reviewed. There was no meeting on Monday 12 November 2012 due to the funeral of Mr. Christy Sargent, father of the Chairman. The Chairman thanked all members for their kind expressions of sympathy and support at that time.

The meeting dealt with the following:-

1. Tractor Run

The members present contributed €5 each to the Tractor Run charity and it is expected that the balance of members will contribute at the January meeting, following which the funds will be passed over to the Tractor Run organisers.

2. Services Sub-committee

Lorcan MacMahon reported having replied to Wicklow County Council in regard to the old Library building. A quotation for repair work has been forwarded to the Council and it is hoped that in discussions with the Council, any rent to be charged will be abated by the amount of the repair work to be carried out by the Forum. It was agreed that the Trustees, for the purposes of taking a lease from Wicklow County Council, would be the Chairman, Michael Sargent, Vice Chairman Pat Pidgeon, Treasurer Liam Fay, Secretary Sally Ann Ryall and PRO Killian McGreal. Lorcan MacMahon advised that discussions are continuing with the Council and that, with the present condition of the building, it is hoped that this can be concluded sooner rather than later.

3. <u>Culture and Heritage Sub-group</u>

Members welcomed Hugo Magee back following his being out of action and this group will report to the January meeting.

4. Theatre

Pat Winters advised of upcoming events:

Pat Winters advised that he has been disappointed that no persons came forward in response to his advice that an educational opportunity to build skills towards getting a job, particularly in sound and lighting areas, existing at the Theatre and that the informal course on sound only attracted four people. Pat Winters stated that perhaps BMDS and BYMDS could follow up on sourcing volunteers as they are at the face of the Theatre. Pat Winters stated that the present situation is that a committee needs to be put in place to run the Theatre, where there is potential to pick up skills and there is a need particularly for someone to look after a calendar of events. It was noted that an open meeting to the public will be held in January and perhaps this will source some new people.

5. Local Area Plan

Gerry O'Neill advised members that there is now the manager's response to the Local Area Plan submissions. It was agreed that members should review the manager's responses and debate the points at the next Forum meeting in January.

6. Lake Walk

The Chairman reported that the Lake Walk Blessington to Russborough is under way and that the first payment of €47,000 will be paid by the Forum this week. The work is being completed in four 2-weekly tranches and the present work is from the Valleymount Road back to the lake at the N81. Members were reminded that, come February, there is an anticipated cash shortfall of approximately €8,000, which will need to be dealt with locally at that time.

7. Environmental Sub-committee

Jason Mulhall, Chairman of the Environmental Sub-committee, reported the good news that:

- A grant of €1,000 has been granted in respect of a biodiversity study.
- Two of the CE workers have been renewed for a further 12 months and there is hope that the third will likewise be extended.
- CWP have approved a development plan application in regard to Tidy Towns for €4,500, of which 90% will be received.
- Jason Mulhall also advised that the "pure mile" is on the agenda and members will hope to liaise with the Community College to have the Green Schools Project reintroduced there.

8. Awards Night

Ariadne Laurenns-Conlon, Frank Hanlon, Nuala Cashin, Nuala Haughian and Jason Mulhall were thanked for the wonderful evening at Avon Rí for the first inaugural Forum Awards Night.

9. Glending

There was a long discussion on the continuing problems at Glending estate. Problems with flooding were raised again a couple of weeks back, when there was heavy rain one weekend. Aisling Dermody advised having taken pictures of the flooding and having forwarded them to Wicklow County Council, following which the Council travelled over that day and saw the problem for themselves. Aisling advised that the Council are now responding and should have construction people on the estate in respect of sorting the water problem this week. In regard to the housing difficulties, it was agreed that the Chairman would arrange a meeting with the Minister for the Environment, at which Forum members David Egar, Gerry O'Neill, Aisling Dermody, Carmel Cashin and the Chairman would attend in regard to the housing problems at Glending.

10. A.O.B.

- Nuala Cashin advised of the sustainable awards which had been achieved by Wicklow at the recent awards ceremony in Europe.
- Gerry O'Neill advised that Wicklow County Council have requested further information on the Dublin Bus shelter planned for Main Street.
- Pat Winters asked about visitors to Wicklow recently and if Wicklow Tourism had been aware of this.
- Good wishes were extended to Men's Sheds, which continues to go from strength to strength.
- Thanks were expressed to Seamus Balfe for his great efforts in having the Christmas lights erected and the Christmas tree due to be erected on 11 December. The Chairman outlined details of the contributions received to date from local businesses.

This completed the business of the meeting.
