Planning & Developments

- Works on mini plaza in the Blessington Square are about 90% complete
 - Concerns highlighted with picnic bench, location and its appropriateness, and the fact it is being used by skate boarders as a ramp is a safety concern.
 - Tourist / History storyboard suggested for the area
 - o Concerns on bins and what is planned for the area regarding cleanup.
 - Age Friendly Seating included in design
 - Age Friendly & Disabled Parking bays to be added in Square
- Action: Jason to follow up with MD on above concerns.

Environment

- Allotments Group No updates on procuring a long term site from WCC.
- The Tidy Towns group continues to be active, litter picks, weeds and general maintenance, volunteers welcome. BTT also working closely with Community College TY classes and facilitating Gaisce participants.



Greenway Update (Caroline Fox)

- Caroline provided an update on plans for the Greenway, and timelines for planning application process and eventual development and delivery.
- Outline map and route overview provided to the membership, including parking and the different loops around the lake side.
- Caroline will provide a further update in November.

BLUC

- Event Planning continues, with plans at an advanced stage for the event in November.
- Fundraising from businesses continues, with thanks to businesses who have contributed.
- Fundraising via a public GoFundMe age is under consideration.
- Event location is under consideration as merits of one or two locations are being considered, the group will make a decision and advise the membership in due course.

<u>A.O.B.</u>

- Blessington Day Care re-opened on Ocotber 6th to a smaller number of guests, but the group are working with HSE and Minister Donnelly to try and extend this.
- Campaign for Pool working with TDs, WCC and Minister Martin to try expedite the delivery
 of a pool in West Wicklow. The group are also advanced in their plans for a Christmas
 market in Russborough.
