Subgroup Updates:

Tidy Towns

Blessington had a great result in this year tidy towns competition, the group & local community were recognised with the awarding of a bronze medal. The Edible Blessington project spearheaded by Blessington Allotments, supported by BTT, and others was a National Award Winner in the Schools Category. Overall a very successful year for Blessington! Members were reminded that volunteers still meet every Sunday at 9am.



Planning

The Lidl and Cairn Homes applications were discussed. Further information was presented to the members via email.

Finance

The Treasurer presented a snapshot of accounts as of 9th October to the membership.

Blessington Lights Up Committee

The group made a presentation on plans for Blessington. They covered the potential options, the application for grants, the capital costs for the project and potential timelines (4 years). The recurring costs (of today and into the future) were also discussed, and the group were to seek an agreement in principle for WCC to support these costs in the coming years. The secretary mentioned that funding streams through Leader might not permit a multiyear project, and that this should be confirmed before finalising a plan.

The Santa Truck will be in Blessington on November 26th, and a callout for volunteers would be made in the coming weeks. The logistics of the visit were still being finalised at time of meeting.

The Towns Christmas Tree was also discussed.
